

Nicholas Johnson Bio

Nicholas has spent much of his life training in dance, first at KOTB Performance Academy under the instruction of Ben Mayne, Daniele Elden and Julie Clark, where he learnt more than dance but a passion for dance and the arts. He completed his training at The Dance Dept. Creative Studios with the continued instruction of Ben & Dani. Nic has completed training in ADA Syllabus tap, R.A.D. Classical ballet, Jazz, Musical Theatre and Performance Classes.

In 2024, Nicholas was selected as the dance captain and part of the Australian Team with IDO AUSTRALIA to compete at the 2024 IDO World Tap Dance Championships where he placed 17th in the world as Adult Male Soloist & 5th in the world in Bill Fowlers Battle of The Feet among other feats. He is very proud to have been selected for the Australian Team again in 2025 and will travel to Prague in October.

In 2023 Nicholas became a valued member of the team, Featured Scare Actor & Tap Dancer at Fearaphobia Scream Park on the Gold Coast performing nightly with both Fearaphobia and as the lead dancer with the Dance Dept. Creative Studios, Thriller' Tribute Flash Mob. Nicholas has performed at Fearaphobia Scream Park & in Cavill Lane's Fright Night Events as a Scare Actor since 2022 using his unique abilities to create a role for himself around his own artistry.

Nicholas is an original and current member of ReBoot, taking his performing skills to new levels and gaining much experience along the way. In 2025, Nicholas is the assistant choreographer and dance educator for ReBoot.

Some performances from his ReBoot journey include; The 2024 Annual Sport Awards, Charlie Mitchell Live @ Twin Towns Showroom, Festival Of Fun @ Metricon Stadium, a ReBoot tour to Sydney where they opened the show at Sydney Tap Fest, performed at HARS (Historical Aviation Restoration Services) under the wing of a Neptune Bomber & filmed their promo video at Blue Scope Steel in Port Kembla and throughout the N.S.W. South Coast. ReBoot have permanent residencies at Brisbane's Eat Street, Northshore, the Surfers Paradise Night Markets and the HOTA Farmers Markets which are constant platforms for Nicholas to be able to extend himself and his skills in front live audiences.

In 2017, Nicholas became a part of KOTB Performance Academy's The Brat Pack, performing as a featured dancer for the Commonwealth Games closing ceremony, along with performances throughout the gold coast including wellbeing day at Arundel State School. The Brat Pack were asked to audition for Australia's Got Talent in 2019 and a toured the U.S.A. in 2018.
